

# Bibliography

A complete listing of titles in a field as wide-ranging and ambitious as environmental history would require a volume or two in itself. This bibliography is only a selection for those seeking further reading. It emphasizes the major book-length works that have appeared in English in recent years, along with a few older titles and journal articles, and largely confines itself to the modern period. The heavy preponderance of American titles may indicate the compiler's bias in background and approach, or it may suggest the extent of American dominance in the field. In any case, there is a considerable literature in other languages that must be omitted here. Many of the items listed contain extensive bibliographies, which should be consulted for a fuller view of the subject.
