SOUDOBÉ TIŠTĚNÉ ZDROJE

Níže uvedené jsou nejužitečnější soudobé knihy, které jsem použil, seřazené podle autorů nebo v případě anonymního autorství podle prvního slova v názvu. Představují pouze část mnohem rozsáhlejšího souboru prostudovaných materiálů, které se podařilo shromáždit v rámci projektu *Imaging Orientalism 1480-1830 [Orientalismus v obrazech]* Printed Images Research Consorcia. Součástí mnohých z nich jsou rytiny a hlubotisky. Kdekoli to bylo možné, snažil jsem se používat současný jazyk. Titulní strana se poprvé objevuje v šestnáctém století a obvykle bývá její součástí i obsáhlý text, který shrnuje obsah díla. Tato zvyklost poněkud komplikuje citování těchto děl – titul jednoho z nich přesahuje čtrnáct řádek. Jen nerad jsem některé názvy zkrátil.
