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Students can also consult the Animation Journal, Animator, Animation, American Cinematographer, Sight and Sound, Screen and Film History for relevant articles. There are also other titles purely dedicated to feature films, studio output and so on, which may also prove useful. Don't forget that books on comedy often have some information on cartoons etc. Similarly, 'readers' of essays about television etc. often have animation-related discussions.
