

## References

The authors and works in this reference list are of two types: (1) works cited by Hume; (2) works cited by the editor in the annotations or introduction to this volume. The editions listed below were relied upon whenever specific references are made by the editor to the works in this list.

In the case of editions having more than one volume, the number of volumes is reported; if volumes were issued in a multi-volume edition in more than a single year, both volume numbers and individual dates of publication are reported. The title is recorded as it appears on the title-page. In a few cases involving non-standard titles, the original title and a standard translation of the title are used. Loeb Library editions are used for classical works wherever possible (abbreviated 'Loeb Library'); the dates listed are printing dates for the individual volumes or series of volumes used by the editor, not original dates of publication or dates of revised editions.

English capitalization is often normalized to modern practice. Entries for Latin and French sources follow late twentieth-century forms. These titles are accompanied by a translation of the title into English. An attempt has been made to supply more accurate translations than those found on the title-pages of many standard, published sources in English. The reader therefore should not expect the translation to follow conventional English renderings.

Entries of the form 'EHU Sect. 3.7' and 'EHU n. 21' refer to one or more locations in Hume's text where the listed work is mentioned or alluded to.
