Two articles in this issue focus on eating disorders. Peterson et al. (p. 1347) compared therapist-led, therapist-assisted, and self-help group treatment for binge eating disorder and found better short-term outcomes with the therapist-led treatment but no differences at 6 and 12 months. Crow et al. (p. 1342), using record linkage, found elevated all-cause mortality rates not only for patients with anorexia nervosa and bulimia nervosa but also for those with eating disorder not otherwise specified, which is widely considered less severe a disorder than the other two.
