Covered in the Journal



This month in the *Journal*, Lester et al (p. 310) examine the emotional and behavioral effects of parental combat deployment on the children of active duty military service personnel. The cover image depicts the separation of families, both physically and emotionally, when a parent is away serving in the armed forces. Against a background of military camouflage, the silhouetted figures in the lower left represent the families of deployed military service members. Splashes of muddy brown reflect the emotional turbidity of the divided family: military parents at war, civilian parents and their children at home. As the U.S. engages in two wars, in Afghanistan and Iraq, studies such as this encourage increased awareness about the psychological impact on children of their parents' deployment, and fuel efforts to design and implement prevention and intervention strategies to foster the mental health of children and families whose parents are stationed around the wU
