Saxon's self-titled debut, widely regarded as the first LP to be released by a New Wave Of British Heavy Metal band, was first released in 1979 on the French Carrere label. Originally forming in Barnsley, South Yorkshire, as Son Of A Bitch, the quintet of Biff Byford on vocals, Graham Oliver and Paul Quinn on lead guitars, Steve Dawson on bass and Pete Gill

on drums, swiftly changed their name to Saxon upon being signed. Produced by John Verity at Livingstone Studios, the original album is now supplemented by pre-album demos (recorded when they were still called Son Of A Bitch), their first BBC session, recorded in 1980 for Tommy Vance's Radio 1 Friday Rock Show, plus live tracks from the inaugural Castle Donington Monsters Of Rock show, 1980. It also features rare and previously unseen photos courtesy of the band's personal archives, as well as extensive liner notes written in co-operation with lead singer Biff Byford.
