



#### 30 To PEG or not to PEG

A review of evidence for placing feeding tubes in advanced dementia and the decision-making process

Percutaneous endoscopic gastrostomy (PEG) has evolved into a common low-risk procedure in current medical practice. Clinical evidence supporting the use of tube feedings in patients with advanced dementia is clearly lacking, yet PEG procedures continue to be performed in a large number of these cases. The decision-making process is complicated, however, and involves the clinician considering such issues as advance directives, ethical considerations, legal/financial concerns, and emotional factors.




