In the course of their lifetimes many people acquire, in addition to their given name, one or more additional names, typically based on some characteristic feature of the person's character, physical appearance, actions, habits, or derived from some event. Such additional names are referred to variously as nicknames, pet names, bynames, pet names, etc., and the distinctions between these terms are not always clear (e.g. Brønne, 2017, p. 238).

When child selecting a given name, parents usually consider what nickname the name could possibly trigger. An appealing diminutive form is often chosen even before the main reason for choosing a particular name. An easy modification of the same into a pejorative nickname may just as easily, however, preclude the child's name from consideration.

The family setting is the first place where the child is called by a nickname, and this is where it is used. Nicknaming is an important linguistic practice in defining group and group identity (Blader, 2014, p. 118). The acquisition of a nickname during early years can be most common during adolescence (Allard, 1987, p. 17; Lai et al., 2009, p. 18) determined that the Chinese in Taiwan acquire most of their names when in primary school, followed by senior high school. The same was reported about the Japanese children (Mizuno, 2016, p. 129). Nicknames function as a way of communication of intimacy, attitudes, feelings, and friendship, instead of the more formal use of the full given name (de Klerk and Bosch, 1996, p. 527). A nickname often identifies an individual better than his or her official name, especially when several people in a group have the same name (Allard, 1987, p. 82; Maher, 2011, p. 1, 8). Likewise, if two members of a particular group carry the same nickname, one of them will end up with a different one.
