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Institutes for living microorganisms were established at the Institute of Parasitology with the financial support of the Department of Protozoology from Prague to České Budějovice in 1985, when the research projects of the Department shifted focus to fish parasitology. Study of these living organisms was included from the very beginning. At the beginning, we had sufficient skills in serological work and transmission electron microscopy techniques, as well as basic knowledge of methods of culturing, but we lacked experience in the observation and identification of these diverse and changeable organisms.

During the first years of our work, we isolated and cultured about 1000 different our isolated strains, stored all these strains in a spore collection, where the corresponding numbers of 001 and deposit in Glenbank, the data obtained were deposited in the Index of Strains n. 001–300.

The present series of cultural collection mentioned in this volume is a by-product of studies on free-living amoebae made within the research projects of the Institute of Parasitology, Biology Centre of the Academy of Sciences of the Czech Republic. Compared to major culture collections maintained commercially, it is based solely on the work of researchers of the Institute.
