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While there are many excellent general clinical textbooks of autonomic disorders, only a few texts are available to provide detailed guidelines on how to perform and interpret autonomic testing. This manual fills the gap and deals mainly with practical aspects of autonomic testing. In accord with the maxim that "a good picture is worth a thousand words," signal drawings are heavily used throughout the text.

Autonomic neurology is a relatively new subspecialty of neurology, and the field is still evolving. This text is

or for everybody who is interested in performing and interpreting autonomic tests. A unique aspect of this book is the use of skin biopsies for the assessment of small autonomic and sensory fibers as a routine part of autonomic testing. Another important feature of this book is the use of continuous cerebral blood flow velocity and end tidal carbon dioxide (CO₂) monitoring in addition to standard heart rate and blood pressure recordings during autonomic testing.
