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Human resource supply in science

- According to the data of the Czech Statistical Office, the Czech Republic has a balanced share of women and men who have the qualifications necessary to work in the scientific and technical professions. The sphere of Czech research and development has, however, long and significantly prioritized qualified men in employment. The share of women among researchers is half that of men with corresponding qualifications. As the main section shows, the situation has also significantly worsened in the technical professions.

Research and development personnel by type of employment (table)

- While the share of women in the position of the researcher has long been around one quarter (25.1%), in the group of R&D staff working in technical professions this percentage has dropped by more than 10 percentage points since 2001. In 2011 women made up 32.1% of staff in technical professions.

Women researchers in sectors of R&D performance (FTE)

- The lowest representation of women among researchers with the business enterprise sector in 2011 women made up 14.7% researchers. The percentage of women has long remained the same.
- The percentage of women has increased slightly in the governmental research sector. In 2011 women made up 36.4% of researchers in this sector.
