Bags of Tunes is an irresistible collection of well-known tunes, folk music and original pieces for beginner violinists to enjoy. The pace is very gradual, based around the first finger pattern, making it ideal consolidation material alongside a tutor or useful and enjoyable sight-reading practice. The pages have deliberately been kept simple so that the patterning in the music is clear. Pupils or teachers can add their own bowing, fingering and dynamics as required. From around page 11 in particular the bowing can be a useful talking point in lessons.
