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
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On the Cover

Treatment of chondrosarcoma usually involves total laryngectomy. This postoperative image is of the glottis after a one-stage resection of 60% of the cricoid cartilage and reconstruction based on the thoracodorsal artery scapular tip autogenous transplant (Tdist). The inferior aspect of the figure is the anterior surface of the larynx. The left side of the figure is the patient's right side.
